Classes offered through Columbus State Community College

English:

- **ENGL 1100 Composition I:** English 1100 is a beginning composition course which develops processes for critically reading, writing, and responding to a variety of texts in order to compose clear, concise, expository essays. The course facilitates an awareness of purpose, audience, content, structure and style, while also introducing research and documentation methods. Course reading and writing assignments may be thematically organized.
 - This is a weighted class with an “A” equaling a 5.2.
 - Prerequisite: COMPASS writing score of 69.
 - This course will be offered during the first semester of the year.
- **ENGL 2367 Composition II:** ENGL 2367 is an intermediate composition course that extends and refines skills in expository and argumentative writing, critical reading, and critical thinking. This course also refines skills in researching a topic, documenting sources, and working collaboratively. Course reading and writing assignments are organized around the diversity of those who comprise identities.
 - This is a weighted class with an “A” equaling a 5.2.
 - Prerequisite: ENGL 1100; minimum grade of “C”.
 - This course will be offered during the second semester of the year.

US History:

- **HIST 1151 American History to 1877:** This course covers a wide range of topics in early American history from the Age of Discovery through the Civil War and Reconstruction. It is an introduction to the study of history and to the political, economic, intellectual and social themes that have shaped our present society.
 - This is a weighted class with an “A” equaling a 5.2.
 - Prerequisite: COMPASS writing score of 69.
 - This course will be offered during the first semester of the year.
- **HIST 1152 American History since 1877:** This course covers a wide range of topics in modern American history from Reconstruction to the present time. It is an introduction to the study of history and to the political, economic, intellectual and social themes that have shaped our present society.
 - This is a weighted class with an “A” equaling a 5.2.
 - Prerequisite: COMPASS writing score of 69.
 - This course will be offered during the second semester of the year.

Classes offered through OCU

- **SI131T Intermediate Algebra (1st semester):** This course includes rational expressions, systems of linear equations and inequalities, graphic solutions, radicals and exponents, quadric functions, conic sections, and exponential and logarithmic functions. Students must have foundational knowledge of linear equations and polynomials as a prerequisite for the class.
- **SI152T College Algebra (2nd semester):** This pre-calculus algebra course includes equations and inequalities, functions and graphs, polynomial and rational functions, exponential and logarithmic functions, matrices and determinants, conic sections, sequences, series, and probability.
- **SI160T General Chemistry (1st semester):** An introduction into the basic concepts of chemistry including the scientific method, metric system, structure of atoms, the periodic table, chemical bonds, mole concept, chemical calculations, states of matter, gas laws, solutions, acids, bases and salts, oxidation/reduction reactions, reaction rates, chemical equilibrium, nuclear, organic and biological chemistry. The course includes a weekly virtual chemistry laboratory.
- **SI132T Introduction to Biology (2nd semester):** The course will introduce the major concepts and principles of biology, emphasizing cell structure and function, heredity, plant and animal organization, taxonomy, and ecology. A weekly laboratory activity is designed to enhance the understanding of course material.
